

Gallery Monitors are the face of the museum and exercise good listening skills, patience and flexibility, as they interface with the public, and are tolerant of noise. A proficiency in foreign languages, especially Spanish, is a plus. Gallery Monitors observe guests behavior in the galleries, uphold museum policies, and answer visitor questions.

People who enjoy talking with the public, working with children and sharing excitement for miniatures, the museum, and its collections will enjoy this opportunity.

Training:

- Welcome orientation: New volunteers attend a 2 hour orientation to learn the policies and procedures of the museum.
- Volunteer receive regular updates about current and upcoming programs, events, policies or procedural changes via email.

Responsibilities:

- Commit to 4 hours of service per week for six months
- Gallery Support volunteers must use email so that they can receive the regular updates concerning policies and procedures, and changes in exhibits and programs.

Benefits:

- 10% discount on museum shop purchases, classes and workshops
- 4 free passes annually after 20 hours of service
- Opportunity to attend docent training lecture presentations to learn more about the collection
- Annual holiday and recognition luncheons
- Volunteers who contribute 100 or more hours annually are invited to a Spring Tea with the Founders
