# **JANUARY 2019: MINIATURE BAKING SHEET & CRESCENT ROLLS**



# **Materials and Supplies:**

Gift Tag Punch Tin Sheet Metal (available at craft stores) Cream Colored Polymer Clay Rolling Pin (or heavy tube for rolling clay flat) Caramel or Light Brown Colored Chalk

# Miscellaneous:

Pencil Ruler Tacky Glue Table Knife

### **Instructions:**





## **Create the Baking Sheet**

Punch out the gift tag from the tin sheet metal. (I used two different sizes of tags to make a matching set of trays.) Using your pencil and ruler, draw a line around the three straight edges of the shape approximately 1/16" in from the edge (this will crease the tin and make it easier to fold). Next carefully fold up the three edges and gently pinch the corners together with your fingertips. Fold the lower line of the decorative edge upwards to form the final lip of the tray and then fold back the top line to form the handle of the tray.



There are different brands and varieties of polymer clay and all of them will work well for this project. Experiment with different shades, or use an assortment of colors to make different types of rolls and pastries.

### Create the Crescent Rolls

Take a pea size amount of polymer clay roll it into a ball. Flatten it out to a diameter of about one inch. Use a table knife to cut six triangles from the circle. Roll up each triangle from the wide end toward the point to form a crescent roll. Use your table knife to scrape your chalk into a small pile of dust. Using your fingertip, rub the chalk onto the top of the crescent roll to give the appearance of a golden crust. Bake your crescent rolls according to polymer clay package directions. Once the crescent rolls have cooled, glue them onto the baking sheet.
